On June 9, 2026, at the City Council Regular Meeting, the City Council voted unanimously to adopt a Resolution of the City Council of the City of California City, California, Ordering the Submission to the Qualified Electors of the City of Hemet an Ordinance Relating to Transient Occupancy Tax at the General Election to be Held on Tuesday, November 3, 2026, and Other Related Matters; Resolution of the City Council of the City of Hemet, California, Setting Deadlines for Filing Written Arguments Regarding the City Initiated Transient Occupancy Tax Measure and directing the City Attorney to Prepare an Impartial Analysis.

The City Council hereby orders that the question to be submitted to the qualified electors at the said General Municipal Election shall appear and be printed on the ballot as follows:

Shall an ordinance be adopted to amend the transient occupancy tax provisions of the California City Municipal Code to increase the tax imposed on transient occupants of hotels from 6% to 10% of the rent charged by the hotel operator, estimated to generate \$75,000 annually, the revenues of which shall be used for general government operations, in perpetuity, be adopted?
